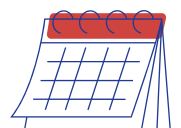


WATER SAFETY

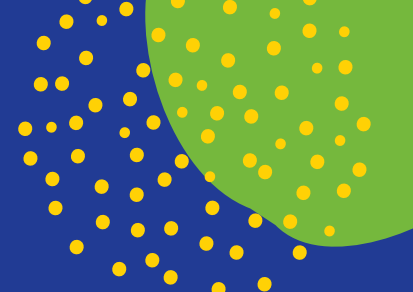
This week, pupils explored an important water safety lesson through Picture News. As the weather becomes warmer and more families spend time at beaches, rivers, lakes and other open-water locations, children learned about the importance of recognising potential dangers around water and how to stay safe. Key messages included stopping and thinking before going near water, staying together with trusted adults, floating on your back if you unexpectedly enter the water, and calling for help in an emergency. The discussion encouraged pupils to reflect on how water can be a fun place to play, exercise and relax, while also understanding the importance of making safe choices around open water.
