Year 6 SATs results were also published this week – we are incredibly proud of all their hard work and determination. Annual Reports are going home with children today.

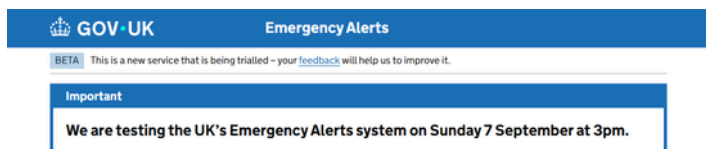
End of Year Reports have been sent home today. Please check your child's bag for them and have a good read. Any queries please do feel free to have a chat to the class teacher.

iPhones and Android phones

To opt out:

1. Search your settings for 'emergency alerts'.
2. Turn off 'severe alerts' and 'extreme alerts'.

Other mobile phones and tablets

Depending on the manufacturer and software version of your phone, emergency alerts settings may be called different names, such as 'wireless emergency alerts' or 'emergency broadcasts'.

The settings can usually be found in one of the following ways. Go to:

- 'message', then 'message settings', then 'wireless emergency alerts', then 'alert'
- 'settings', then 'sounds', then 'advanced', then 'emergency broadcasts'
- 'settings', then 'general settings', then 'emergency alerts'

Then turn off 'severe alerts', 'extreme alerts' and 'test alerts' (Gov.uk, 2025)
